






UNMUTING THE MUTED VOICES OF TAMIL

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SAARVAGAN (aka) HARISRINIVASAN




Harisrinivasan, widely known as Saarvagan, was born on September 7, 1929, in Vellore, Tamil Nadu. He worked in a hospital in England for six years starting in 1954, where he also got married. In the 1980s, he spent three years in Portland. Saarvagan gained recognition for his innovative techniques in rehabilitating hands affected by leprosy, methods that continue to bear his name. In acknowledgment of his significant contributions, he was honored with the Padma Shri in 1984.

A prolific writer, Saarvagan authored 41 short stories and 3 novellas, totaling over 500 pages. His literary work spans across various genres, including plays, short stories, and poetry. His writings have been published under the title Saarvagan Stories by Nattrinai Publications.

The story 'Kanavu Kathai' (Dream Story) was selected as the best short story of the year by "Literary Thoughts" organization.

Satire is the predominant tone in his stories. Through a self-deprecating, teasing perspective, he criticizes our contemporary life in his stories. He doesn't provide any conclusions or solutions in his stories. Yet while reading, there are many questions and thrills for us to absorb. His story 'Newman', written in 1976 during the Emergency, though not directly referencing anything, subtly discusses how authority creates a slave mentality in the psychology of common people through

the ages."

INDRAN RAJENDRAN




Indran is Tamil Nadu's most important art-critic, poet, translator, artist, and writer, writing in both Tamil and English. He received the Sahitya Akademi Translation Award in 2011. In 2000, he curated a major exhibition of 133 modern artists for the Thiruvalluvar statue inauguration in Kanyakumari. A recipient of the Ananda Coomaraswamy Fine Arts Award from SRM University's Tamil Forum, Indran has also directed documentary films on art. His expertise was further recognized when the British Council selected him to research Indian artifacts in London museums. His contributions span literature, art curation, and cultural documentation, showcasing his deep engagement with both the written word and visual arts.

P. VIGNESHWARAN (aka) VIDUTHALAI SIGAPI



P. Vigneshwaran (aka) Viduthalai Sigapi (b. 1993) hails from Keezhapungudi, Sivagangai district. A Dalit activist, poet, and screenwriter, he currently works as an assistant director with acclaimed filmmaker Pa. Ranjith. His debut poetry collection employs free verse and stark imagery to challenge caste hierarchies, rewrite marginalized histories, and confront social injustice.

His poem "Malakuzhi Maranam (Death in the Sewers)" faced institutional resistance for its reinterpretation of mythical figures. In the poem, Ram, Lakshman, Hanuman, and Sita are depicted entering the sewers to clear a blockage, a keen departure from their traditional heroic roles, it challenges the sanitized, idealized narratives of myth, using the metaphor of filth and decay to confront the hypocrisy of social and religious structures. Despite facing backlash, Viduthalai Sigapi's creative work continues to document erased histories and expose the violence of caste and class systems.

"Viduthalai Sigapi's poetry emerges naturally like organic produce, capturing the authentic Tamil aesthetic of marginalized voices. I'd like to affectionately call these verses 'Organic poetry' for their raw, unfiltered truth and beauty" says poet Indran.

Viduthalai sigapi's "*Erisoru*" (*Hurl rice*) is a collection of counter poetry that centers on liberation from caste, intersectional feminism, social justice, and Dalit identity.

Using free verse, direct language, and powerful metaphors, the poet challenges notions of purity, rewrites mythology, and documents histories erased by mainstream narratives, giving voice to the marginalized.

It also celebrates minor deities and rooted cultural traditions.

IYOTHEE THASS PANDITHAR




Iyothee Thass Pandithar (1845-1914), a trailblazing Tamil anti-caste activist, social reformer, and practitioner of Siddha medicine, was instrumental in challenging the entrenched caste system and advocating for the rights of the marginalized. Born in the former Madras Presidency, he was a multifaceted leader, proficient in Tamil, English, Pali, and Sanskrit. A fierce advocate for the oppressed, he founded the Panchamar Mahajana Sabha (1891) to combat untouchability and envisioned the untouchables as Adi-Tamilars, distinct from Hindus.

A champion of religious and social reforms, he revived Buddhism in South India by establishing the Sakya Buddhist Society in 1898. As a writer, Thass launched the influential Dravida Pandian magazine (1885) and Oru Paisa Tamizhan newspaper (1907), using literature as a tool for social change. His legacy also includes the pioneering Panchami Lands scheme, which provided land to the landless. Revered as the "Father of Social Reforms in South India," Thass's vision for equality continues to resonate, making him a key figure in India's social and literary history.

Pandit Iyothee Thass (1845-1914), the pioneer of the Dravidian movement, was the foremost anti-caste social activist and neo-Buddhist of the late nineteenth and early twentieth century Tamil Nadu. He was a Siddha practitioner who converted to Buddhism and founded the magazine Tamilian. Compiled for the first time in 1997, this first of the three volumes are his writings from the magazine (1907-1914) on contemporary politics and political movements and Buddhist readings on Tamil history, culture, and society. These volumes influenced and altered the insurgent Dalit identity movements of the 1990s and continue to draw intellectual attention to this day. A translation of Thass's essays would be a timely contribution that would help readers learn about him through his own words.

DR. STALIN RAJANGAM



Dr. Stalin Rajangam (1980), who researched on Pandit Iyothee Thass for his doctoral thesis, is an Assistant Professor in Tamil at The American College, Madurai. His writings on Dalit history, Tamil literature and Cinema focusses on alternative cultural traditions. English translations of his writings appeared in national dailies, online magazines and in academic anthologies.

He is part of the editorial board of a leading Tamil magazine, Kalachuvadu. He has published more than ten significant works, which include, Iyothidasa Pandithar: Vaazhum Boutham, Ezhudha Kilavi, Tamil Cinema: Punaivil Iyangum Samoogam and Peyarazindha Varalaaru. He received the SPARROW literary award in 2017, and Canada Vilakku award in 2022.



Stalin Rajangam, in his doctoral thesis, Iyothee Thassar: Vaazhum Boudham (Iyothee Thass: Living Buddhism, 2016), Peyarazhindha Varalaaru (How a Name was Lost, 2016) studied the scholarship of Thass, his intervention in the sociocultural, political discourse, and his relationship with his contemporaries. In Vaithiyar Iyothee Thassar (Iyothee Thass: The Medicine Practitioner), the first of its kind, Rajangam expertly connects the influence of Siddha medicinal background in Thass's thought world, the shamanic literary past of Tamil and Thass's methodology, to offer his own layered readings of Tamil society and its cultural

history.

Whilst his early essays, collected as Aariya Udhadum Unadhu, Dravida Udhadum Unadhu (The Double Speak of Arya and Dravida are Both Yours, 2008) examined the portrayal of caste in cinema, this book identified the nature of caste politics in the much-celebrated nativity cinema of the 1980s, caste as reflected in folklore and their subsequent portrayal in cinema, the question of gender, and the influence of film songs in the casteist society. The essays also problematize the limits of Tamil identity as eulogized on screen. Rajangam's readings offer rich frameworks for analyzing other film industries in India.

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
