
He has written over a hundred articles, authored ten books (five in English and five in Tamil), and translated two manuals and several artcles for leading news papers.



Inspired by his rural upbringing, his writings explore themes of agricultural life, particularly the cow-taming tradition, celebrating its cultural and historical significance.


WORDS SPROUTED IN THE LAND

In Tamil, there is a deep and timeless tradition of celebrating the land through poetry. During the Sangam era (3rd century BC to 3rd century AD) ancient Tamilians categorized their land into five distinct landscapes, known as Ain Thinai or 5 landscapes:

Kurinji (mountainous regions), Mullai (pastoral forests), Marutham (riverine agricultural land), Neithal (coastal regions), and Paalai (arid regions).

Maharasan's poems explore all five Thinais in a modern form. The people portrayed in these works are primarily agricultural laborers cultivating their fields. The author also highlights the inseparable bond that connects Tamilians and Sri Lankan Tamils, akin to an umbilical cord.

Through his poems, Maharasan beautifully depicts themes such as Mother Mountains, Mother Forest, farmer women, love, the struggles of refugees, societal injustice, and the rise of the use-andthrow culture in recent years.
