

Kalaignar M. Karunanidhi (1924-2018) was the five-time Chief Minister of the Indian state of Tamil Nadu. He is a writer at heart. He fought for equality and social justice with the might of his pen. He wrote short stories, plays, novels, essays, film scripts, and poems to drive home the message of truth and justice. He earned a living by writing for films in Modern Cinemas, Salem, in the 1940s. It was a bold step on his part

to believe in the power of writing and make a full-time career out of it. Penned by him, *Parasakthi* (1952) became a blockbuster. His works of fiction and non-fiction roused people to action on the ground. Most of his works are a call to action. He kept the millions of followers of the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK), the political party he headed for almost five decades, engaged by the truth of his words. Mahatma Gandhi described politics as positive action. Kalaignar M. Karunanidhi became an example of positive action for India.

He understood the Tamil language's power in his teenage years and used it to uplift millions of people from the margins of Tamil society. He is a phenomenal writer by market standards. His works sold in the millions because they had a larger-than-life purpose and a social justice and equality mission.

Set in 20 BCE, the narrative unfolds with the signing of a crucial Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between *Karikala Chola and Peruvazhuthi Pandian*. These two kings, along with pivotal characters like Poet Kaarikannanar's daughter Muthunagai, Peruvazhuthi Pandian's aide Chezhiyan, rebel king Irungovel, and his sister Thamarai, play key roles in the story. The plot weaves intricate relationships, including Muthunagai falling in love with Irungovel, unaware of his true identity.

Irungovel, concealing his role, navigates political complexities with Chezhiyan's love for Thamarai. Tensions rise as Irungovel reveals his identity, leading to conflict and intrigue. The narrative culminates in Muthunagai thwarting rebel attacks, Karikala Chola's realization of mistakes, and the subsequent focus on commerce and development.

The story expands to diplomatic ties with the Roman Empire, with Chezhiyan representing Tamil Nadu in Rome. The author vividly describes Chezhiyan's reception in Rome, including interactions with Juno, a minister in Augustus Caesar's court. Returning to Madurai, Chezhiyan rejects the throne, emphasizing the greatness of warriors and highlighting the enduring unity between the Cholas and Pandyas.

Silamboli Su. Chellappan



Silamboli Su. Chellappan was born on September 24, 1928, in Siviyampalayam village near Namakkal, Tamil Nadu, India. His discourses on the Tamil epic Cilappatikaram were well known. R.P. Sethupillai, author and scholar, named him Silamboli Chellappan - meaning One Who Propagates Cilappatikaram. He wrote commentaries for Cilappatikaram and Manimekhalai, two of the five epics of Tamil.

He supervised the preparation of souvenirs for the World Tamil Conferences in Chennai and Madurai and the World Semmozhi Conference in Coimbatore. He also served as Director of the Tamil Nadu Government's Tamil Development Department. He was the Director of the Publications Department at the Tamil University in Thanjavur.

Four Lines For Life

The Naladiyar is a didactic literature revered as a text as competent as Tirukkural. Tirukkural is considered as sacred as a Scripture by Tamils.

It contains 400 poems, each containing four lines. Every poem deals with virtues and ethics, extolling virtuous behaviour. Monks belonging to the Jain faith wrote this text. The commentary of Silamboli Su Chellappan helps the readers decipher the hidden meanings of the multi-layered text.

The author researched for his commentaries on Cilappatikaram and Manimekhalai. That gave him power over the vocabulary of the Sangam age.

The ninth poem rebukes those who hoard wealth. "One who does not put money to work for self or others has lost it already," writes Chellappan. The author explains the 189th poem: "If your mind is clear, you won't be perturbed by those who provoke you." 370th poem is about the love of sex workers. "Just as the flood recedes after the rains, the love of sex workers goes away after your earning capacity diminishes."

V.O. Chidambaram



Vallinayagam Olaganathan
Chidambaram Pillai (5 September
1872 - 18 November 1936), also
known as Kappalottiya Tamizhan
("Tamil Helmsman"), was an Indian
freedom fighter and a prominent
leader in the Indian independence
movement. He founded the Swadeshi
Steam Navigation Company in 1906
to compete against the monopoly of
the British India Steam Navigation
Company (BISNC). He launched the

first indigenous Indian shipping service between Tuticorin (India) and Colombo (Sri Lanka) with the Swadeshi Steam Navigation Company (SSNC), competing against British ships. Tuticorin Port Trust, one of India's thirteen big ports, is named after him. Once a member of the Indian National Congress, he was later charged with sedition by the British government and sentenced to life imprisonment and canceled his license to practice as a barrister.

Story of Valliammai

'Story of Valliammai' is the story of the first wife of V.O. Chidambaram Pillai, the Indian freedom fighter who challenged the British commercially. Valliammai has been a source of strength for the social reforms led by V.O. Chidambaram. She stood by him in fighting untouchability and fed Dalits at home. She supported the cause of freedom by donating her jewelry.

'She has come like a swan and leads me from the front,' is how V.O.C describes his wife Valliammai. 'She has been a rock-solid support and took great care of V.O.C,' is how Sankara Valli Nayagam, biographer of V.O. Chidambaram, depicts her. V.O.C says she is the embodiment of knowledge.

Considering the sacrifice of Valliammai, V.O.C's second wife Meenakshi actively enabled the publishing of her biography with the commentary of V.O.C. It is a rare piece of literature that records the work of Valliammai in India's freedom struggle and social reforms.

Intense conversations are a way of life for the author. He believes in the power of words to reshape our future. He incessantly records the lives of fisher people with a critical understanding of the state and the public. Protection of the ocean ecosystem is the protection of humanity from extinction. The knowledge of the ocean exists within the coastal communities. Preservation of this knowledge is vital to understanding how climate impacts our planet, argues the author. His Ocean-centric writings are a continuation of the water-centric thinking found in the Sangam Age.





In a column on prisons and books, he talks about how India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru used his time in prison to write books. These columns appear every week in Kumudam, a popular Tamil magazine.

The book is a collection of literary journalism pieces written from 2019 to 2021. The author uses the idioms of the Tamil language and quotes the masters of the language to drive home a message in each column. The literary experience of each column made this book into the shortlist for the Sahitya Akademi Award in 2023. The columns are informative and have universal appeal besides having a unique style of writing.




S. Tamilselvan


Kavin Malar

This is the debut short story collection by Iraiyuman Saagar.


Booma Easwaramoorthi






Dr. K. Subashini


Mayilai Seeni Venkatasami

Gautama Buddha's Life







Hasan Manto in his short stories find a natural place in his poetry without disrupting its flow. These references add layers of cultural depth and intense meaning to the central themes of his poems, often evoking strong emotional resonance in the reader.

On rare occasions, this interaction grows into "ironic tension between opposites." A poem about the Sangam work Natrinai's explanation of who constitutes the majority and the minority exemplifies this. When it comes to religious fundamentalism, the poet humorously highlights that there is no distinction between the majority and the minority—both are eternally the enemies of humanity. He demonstrates this with his reconstruction of the 86th Purananuru poem, revealing his sharp sense of humor.

Many poems in this collection speak with pain and anguish about the cruelty, manipulation, immorality, and inhumanity of communal politics.

Sukirtharani

They emphasized moral codes for women and the sanctity of the female body. Even poetry written by women often operated within these confines.

After the 1990s, a new wave of female poets broke these boundaries. They took the very body that was seen as weak and wielded it as a weapon. One such poet is Sukirtharani.

A fundamental aspect of Sukirtharani's poetry is her bold assertion of the female body collapsing under the weight of imposed sanctities. Sukirtharani views everything she observes as an extension of this body. In one of her poems, she compares an empty road to a naked body. Time and again, she reclaims the grandeur of external images and instills them into her poetry as representations of the female body.
