Initially using the name 'Vidakander,' he later became an assistant teacher under the guidance of 'Kalki' Sathasivam. His journey witnessed notable events, including Gandhiji's Navakali Yatra.

Saavi's career thrived as he contributed comic articles to Kalki and became the editor of 'Ananda Vikatan,' achieving fame with the series 'Marriage in Washington.' He founded magazines like 'Vellimani,' 'Savi,' 'Poovali,' 'Directions,' and 'Mona.' A respected journalist, he gained the support of figures like Periyar, Kamaraj, Rajaji, and Kalki.

Saavi's writings, marked by humor and depth, spanned over 60 years, earning him national recognition. He passed away at the age of 85 in 2001, leaving a lasting legacy in Tamil literature. His biography, 'Savi-85,' was penned by Rani Maindhan.






