
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KI. RAJANARAYANAN




Ki. Rajanarayanan, known by his Tamil initials Ki. Ra., was a celebrated Indian folklorist and writer hailing from Kovilpatti, Tamil Nadu. Revered as the "Guardian of Tamil oral tradition," he left an indelible mark on Tamil literature. Among his works, the notable ones are Mayamaan and Nattupura Kathai Kalanjiyam. In recognition of his literary contributions, he received the Sahitya Akademi Award in 1991.

Sahitya Akademi Award, Literary achievement special award. Rajanarayanan's literary repertoire spans folktales, short stories and novels. His collection of folktales include Tamizh Nattu Nadodi Kathaigal, Tamizh Nattu Gramiya Kathaigal, Thatha Sonna Kathaigal, Naattupura Kathaigal Part 1, and Naattupura Kathaigal Part 2.

Ki Rajanarayanan has the unique ability to make the reader feel emotive even towards his so-called antiheroes.


Cultural Identity and Social Justice

A robber kills a pregnant woman and faces death in Gopallapuram. Telugu speakers moved to Tamil Nadu to escape Muslim rulers and made the land fertile. Bandits fail to raid a village due to clever villagers. Ki. Rajanarayanan, a Sahitya Akademi Award winner, mixes legend, myth, and history in a modern classic.

The story focuses on the Kottaiyar family. Mangathayaaru Ammal shares their past and her own tale. The writer tells two periods: their escape long ago and present Gopallapuram built by those fleeing Muslim rule. Chenna Devi, the narrator's cousin, faced trouble with a king and the family fled, losing lives during the journey.

They cleared a burnt forest section for farming and started a communal life. Food was initially shared, then individuals began producing their own.

"Gopallapurathu Makkal" by Ki Rajanarayanan (Ki Ra) tells how Gopallapuram came to be. It won the Sahitya Akademi Award in 1991. The book has two parts, showing Gopallapuram's history until India's independence in 1947. The first part focuses on Kittappan and Achintalu's love story. Back then, there were no schools, and villagers went to Madurai for shopping. Seeni Naicker faced issues while preparing for his wedding.

The first part depicts village life changing with new things like lamps and tea. Kittappan and Achintalu's story challenges traditions.

The second part discusses historical events, mixing facts and fiction with figures like Gandhi and Bhagat Singh. Translating the book is tricky due to dialect. Footnotes or glossaries could help explain it and caste differences. Language nuances indicate caste hierarchies; different fonts might highlight these distinctions.

Su. Tamilselvi is a Tamil Nadu writer. Her fictions are placed in university's syllabus.



Her book "Manikkam" was awarded by Tamil Nadu Government Department of Tamil Development in the best books of the year 2002 in the Pudhinam category.

Social Justice and Reform, Mental Health and Well being Ramu Keedhari lives in a cottage with his wife Irulai, daughter Muthammal, and adopted son Vellaichamy. One rainy night, a mentally challenged pregnant woman gives birth to twin girls. Ramu Keedhari thinks the girls are his reincarnation, naming them Sivappi and Karicha. After six years, Sambasivam adopts Sivappi. Ramu's daughter invites him to stay, and he leaves Karicha and Vellachamy behind.

Later, Karicha and Sivappi reunite, facing difficulties due to Sambasivam's actions. Sambasivam commits suicide upon learning of his daughters' marriage. Karicha is heartbroken by Sivappi's death. Karicha and Vellachamy move due to grazing land issues, encountering Ramu's brother-in-law. Disagreements arise, and Karicha goes back to Ramu Keedhari. Later, she discovers she's pregnant, chooses independence, and teaches her son goat herding skills.

Karicha dies from a snakebite, and Ramu Keedhari raises her son. There are various family conflicts, including Vellaichamy's changing decisions and Karicha's struggles. Despite challenges, Karicha prioritizes her child's education before passing away.

THE RISING GIRL (KATTRAZHAI)

In this concept, you can see the neverending smile and the never-drying tears that the uptown, which is a haven for abandoned women like her, hides.

By creating a world where these self-reliant and self-respecting working women live together as a commune, Su.Tamilselvi once again revives the hopes of the woman.

This story is about how male dominated men look down on women and try to oppress them. However only a few women are able to break free from this domination, and many others suffer physical and mental injuries and continue to live with them.



KA.ANBAZHAGAN




Global Literary Agent Training Program
